



## **Notice of Availability of Electronic Communications**

Texas law provides that chief appraisers of county appraisal districts, appraisal districts, and appraisal review boards may communicate electronically through email or other methods with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically in place of mailing.

Taxpayers may file a form between January 1 and April 1 to request to receive notification from the appraisal district and to communicate electronically for:

- Notices of Appraised Value,
- Exemption/Special Valuation applications,
- Exemption/Special Valuation communication, and
- Protest hearing documents to and from the ARB

The appraisal district will deliver such notices as requested in an Adobe Acrobat (pdf) file. All documents submitted to the district by the property owner must be delivered in an Adobe Acrobat (pdf) file or as a jpg or tiff image file. All documents must also have an original signature.

The Chief Appraiser has the discretion to enter into agreements or to choose not to do so in most instances. The property owner will be notified by certified mail of the chief appraiser's denial of the request with an explanation for the denial.

The chief appraiser must accept protests filed on properties that are receiving a residential homestead exemption through its website [www.freestoncad.org](http://www.freestoncad.org) or by email to [arb@freestoncad.org](mailto:arb@freestoncad.org). The district will also provide electronic communication regarding these protests to the email address provided by the property owner on the protest form.

Please be advised that it is the property owner's responsibility to provide a valid or updated email address to the district. This may be done by sending an email to [general.info@freestoncad.org](mailto:general.info@freestoncad.org) or by contacting the appraisal district directly by mail at:
